creativity to enhancing the STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and math) programs offered to club members. She was instrumental in the creation and funding of the "ArtMobile" that travels between clubs offering children experience and training in the world of arts and crafts. Barbara serves on the WLG Executive Steering Committee and chaired both the 2010 and 2011 benefits.

Her other philanthropic activities include the Heart of America, which focuses on children's literacy and community service (2010 and 2011 gala chair); Good Weave International, dedicated to eliminating forced child labor and providing educational opportunities to these children throughout India, Afghanistan, and Nepal (board member); In a Perfect World, dedicated to educational and support opportunities for children globally (Advisory board member); The Phillips Collection (Museum "Ambassador"); and the McLean Project for the Arts (board member).

She has been named one of the DC area's best interior designers in numerous publications.
